- **\*\*Plastic drawers (optional)**  
We will only permit the small 3-drawer unit (approx. 12" wide x 25" tall x 14" deep). These drawers can be used for socks, underwear, or however your child sees fit.
- **\*35 qt. Sterilite bin (Teen Campers Only)** This bin is for your Teen Camper's under-bed storage for snacks. This bin must be 35 quarts (or less) and measure 18" high (or less). Fill the bin up with your Teen Camper's (NUT-FREE) snacks before you ship the box. This snack bin can only be brought/sent on Opening Day.



## PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU LEAVE AT HOME:

- Clothing with inappropriate language or messaging
- All cooking instruments

## PLEASE NOTE:

- Please send your child's belongings in 2 Camp SOFT trunks. (No hard trunks)  
**DO NOT** pack in more than TWO pieces of luggage per child.
- Packing more than two bags is a clear indication that you've packed too much :)
- Please LABEL EVERYTHING!
- While packing, please pay close attention to Camp Lavi's dress code.
  - PLEASE TAKE NOTE that this dress code applies to Shabbat as well.

All campers are expected to dress in a manner befitting an orthodox Jewish camp. Campers are not permitted to wear clothing with inappropriate wording or graphics on them. Campers in violation of the dress code will be sent back to change. Please pack for your camper in accordance with the dress code.

**GIRLS** are required to wear skirts to davening. For swim, girls must wear tankinis or one piece bathing suits (no bikinis), and a cover-up must be worn when going to and from the swimming areas. Girls are NOT permitted to wear tank tops, belly shirts, or cold shoulder shirts. Deep V-Necks are not permitted. Shorts are permitted as long as they provide coverage to the mid-thigh. Short shorts, biker shorts, and mini jean shorts are not permitted. On Shabbat girls are to wear dresses or skirts approaching the knee and tops that are appropriate.

**BOYS** must wear tzitzit to davening and a kippah or hat at all times. On Friday night boys are to wear white collared shirts (either button down or polo) and Shabbat appropriate pants (no jeans of any color). They will be allowed to wear a polo shirt with a collar (any solid color on Shabbat day). Hooded sweatshirts and hats are not allowed on Shabbat.
